



Bulgaria – the Republic of Bulgaria, is a country in Southeast Europe. It is situated on the eastern flank of the Balkans, and is bordered by Romania to the north, Serbia and North Macedonia to the west, Greece and Turkey to the south, and the Black Sea to the east. Bulgaria covers a territory of 110,994 square kilometres, and is the sixteenth-largest country in Europe.

Sofia is the nation's capital and largest city; other major cities are Plovdiv, Varna and Burgas.







Our Town - Kula

Kula is a town in northwestern Bulgaria. It is the administrative centre of Kula Municipality part of Vidin Province. Located just east of the Serbian-Bulgarian border, it is the third largest town in the province after Vidin and Belogradchik. Kula lies 30 kilometres west of Vidin and 13 kilometres east of the border checkpoint at Vrashka Chuka. As of 2021, the town has a population of 2400 inhabitants.





Historical information indicates that here, very close to the beginning of Stara Planina, man sought a place to reside and seek refuge in prehistoric times.

Kula is the modern site of the Late Roman fortress of Castra Martis, the ruins of which can still be seen today, which also was a bishopric in the Roman province of Dacia Ripensis and remains a Latin Catholic titular see under the Latin name. During the Roman Empire, the city was called Castra Martis. Since the seventh century it has been within the boundaries of the medieval Bulgarian state.














Sredno uchilishte (Secondary School) "Vasil Levski" is a school in which study students from I to XII class. The history of our school covers 180 years. The school has 200 students and 30 teachers. The school is the only one in Kula municipality. Every day to school and back traveling 39 students from the villages of the municipality. From I to VII class training is not profiled, and in VIII to XII class - with professional training in "Economic Information Assurance" and a new specialty "Technology of pharmaceutical and perfumery and cosmetics". The students study business communications, economics, accounting, enterprise management, economic informatics, programming, computer science, organic and inorganic chemistry, production of pharmaceutical and perfumery products and others.

Our students come from different social groups. Many parents are unemployed. Lack of employment, which causes migration of residents of the town and municipality to bigger cities and abroad to improve their lives is one of the main problems that affect our institution due to lack of parental support for our students, as some of the students are grown only by grandparents. There is an increasing number of students who are at risk of social exclusion and who have low expectations and motivation in what refers to success in school. We also have students with special educational needs. One of our goals is to integrate them fully in school life.

- We found a new use for the already used boxes and jars by making something useful. This is how we recycle our waste.












The Greek good method

The students made the hotel. They collected small sticks, dry grass, reeds and placed them in plastic bottles. Then they hang them on the trees in the yard of our school








ENGINEERING in Latvia

Latvia trying Bulgaria's good practice

- 8th and 9th grades made water dispensers.
 Each grade made different type of water dispenser.
- It was a great experience and student minds were full of ideas on how to decorate the water dispenser or make it work better.









Latvia trying Poland's good practice

- 5th and 6th grade students of the natural sciences in the forest and school territory conducted a research: "Bugs and their houses in nature".
- 6th grade students told 2nd-4th grade students about the insect houses they had seen and the importance of insects in nature.
- Together with the help of internet resources, they searched for ideas on what kind of insect house to make by yourself, so that it would be the most appropriate to what you see in nature.





- 2. 8. grade students were involved in making an insect house in home economics andwoodworking classes most relevant to those seen in nature.
- Ideas were searched on internet recourses.
- The bug house was placed in the school territory, so, 5th and 6th grade students in natural science lessons could continue their expedition "Bugs in school territory".







Latvia trying Greece's good practice

- As there is no solar panel available in the school, we completed the task by combining the Latvian literature lesson with engineering by reading A. Upīša's story "Boys of the Moss Village"
- While reading the work, the students had to find a description of the house, the yard of the house, the environment in which the characters of the story lived and make a model based on it.

- Students had to explore the diversity and key differences in bird cages.
- Next step was creating a sketch of the chosen birdcage layout, applying an appropriate scale.
- Miniature bird cages were made by 5th 8th grade students.






Engineering: The Greek good practice










Activities during the 3rd LTTA in Bulgaria




















Tuesday

STEAM workshops: various engineering activities, experiments, small practical projects, art activities, visiting local businesses with an automated production process, physical activities.







































Thursday





